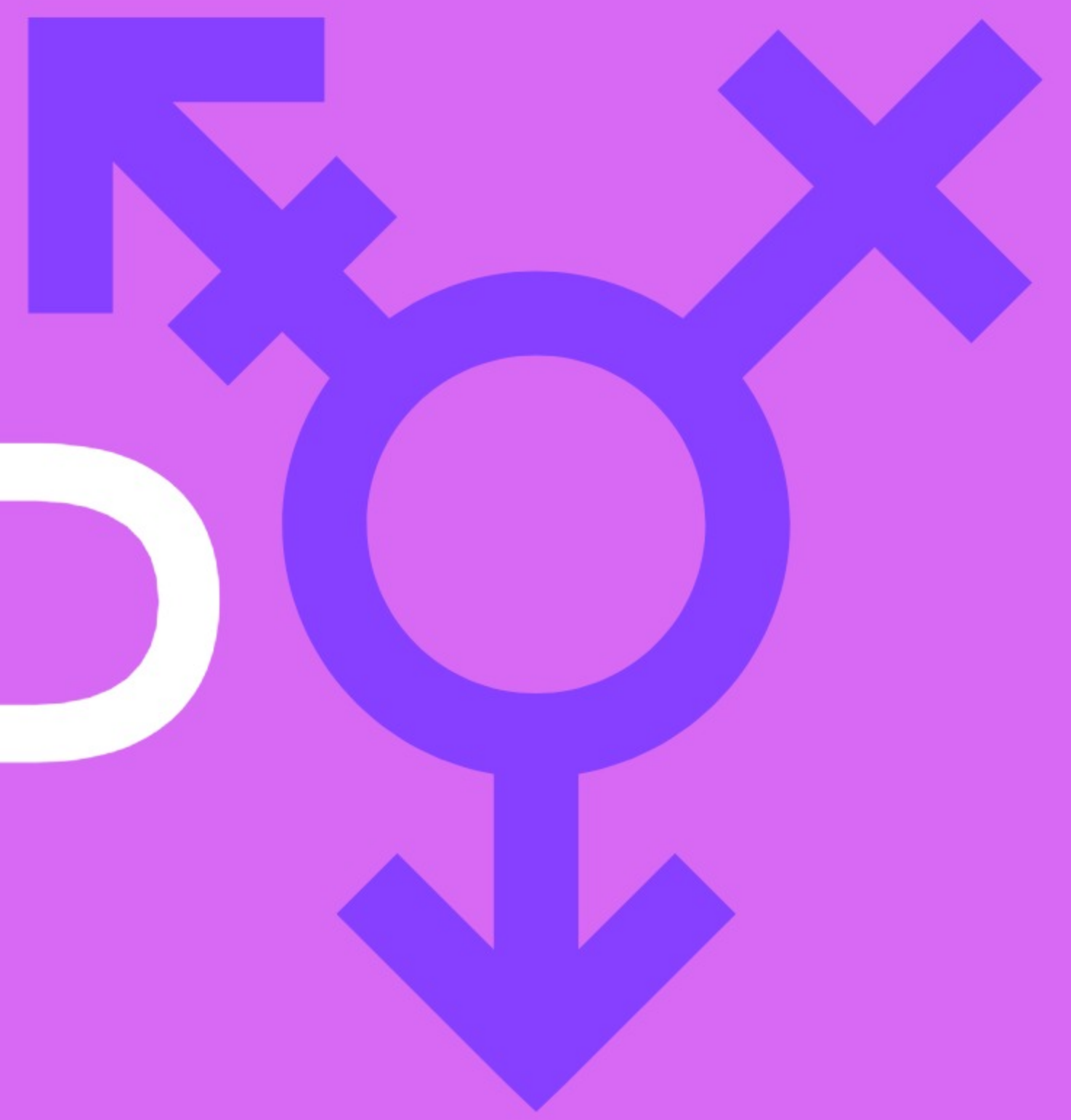


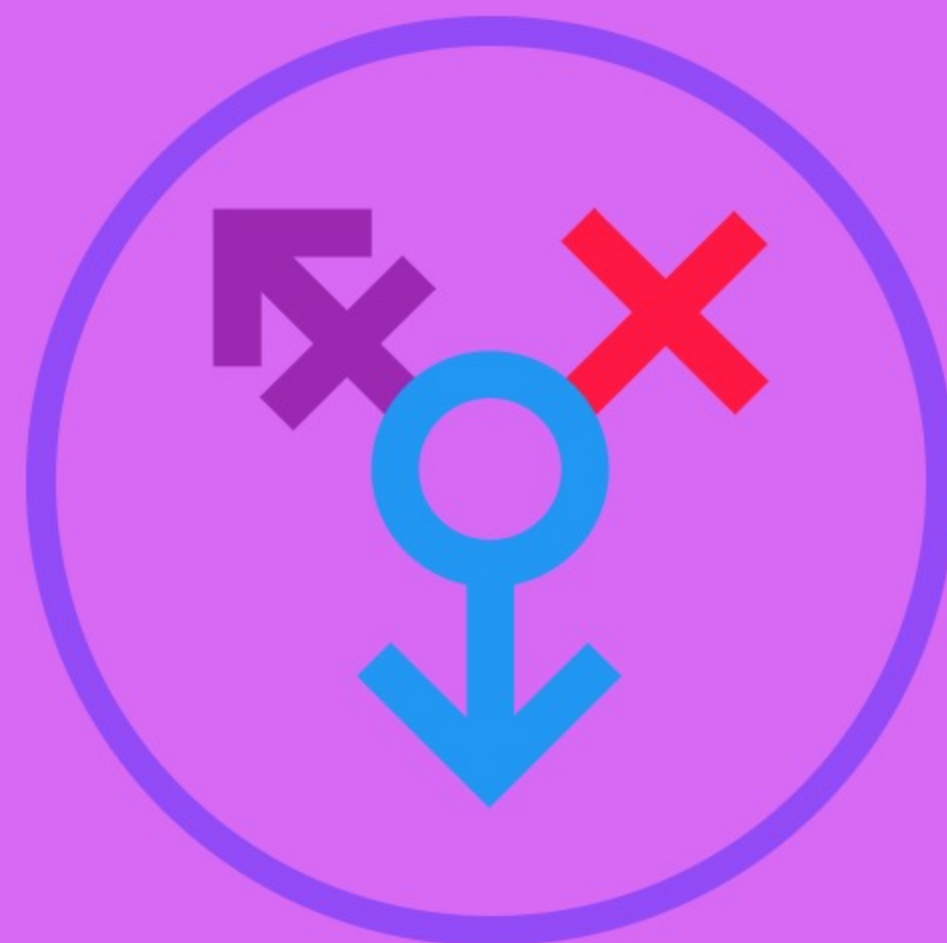

# PrEP



## What is PrEP?

- ✓ It is a drug that HIV - negative people can take to prevent HIV.
- ✓ It is taken before being exposed to HIV.
- ✓ It is a way of protecting yourself if you are having sex with a person or people who are HIV + or if their status is unknown.



## Who is it for?

- ✓ Anyone can take PrEP, regardless of gender.
- ✓ There are specific considerations for cis and trans women interested in taking PrEP. It is important to talk to a health care provider to help with your decision making.



## How to get it?

- ✓ There is coverage for PrEP through the Ontario Drug Benefit program & for First Nations & recognized Inuit people (with status) through the Federal Non-Insured Health Benefits Program.
- ✓ If you are considering PrEP, ask your health care provider or a local AIDS service organization more information.
